



Trinity Methodist Church

Whitfield & Brown have extended the town centre church on the rear elevation and internally modified and refurbished the existing building to create a highly adaptable worship and event space.

The church has been transformed and rejuvenated by replacing external walls, steel works, roof, window, external doors, internal partitions, doors & ironmongery, floor, wall & ceiling finishes, fixtures / fittings, sanitary and disposal installations. New M&E services have been installed and external works provided.

Included in the contract were the re-design of the pulpit and the creation of a labyrinth within the newly laid oak flooring.

The church is very much part of the community and now offers a variety of community led services including, café & kitchen, bread making activities, creative arts and music, active ageing centre and crèche.

Key Aspects

- ✓ Close collaboration with the design team to ensure financial outgoing did not exceed the allocated budget
- ✓ Co-ordinated parking/access/egress with local business's who lease car park space within the church grounds.
- ✓ On-going communication with church elders to advise on progress.
- ✓ Worked in conjunction with "men in sheds" a local initiative to recycle & re-use waste material including flooring & pews.
- ✓ Formation of a new entrance to meet DDA.
